

DHS's Proposed Fee Menu: What's Next for H-1B Quota (Cap) Cases?

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has proposed a new rule requiring a fee of \$103,265 for all cap-subject H-1B petitions starting in calendar year 2027, including those subject to the advanced-degree cap/quota. According to the proposal, the fee would need to be paid at the time of filing cap-subject H-1B petitions, in addition to existing fees, to help cover the administrative costs of the federal immigration system. In this webinar, the speakers will discuss the proposed rule, its potential impact, and the timeline for implementation. The speakers will also compare the new proposal with the September 2025 presidential proclamation, which imposed a \$100,000 fee on certain new H-1B petitions—a provision that a federal court recently vacated.
