TN Validity Period to Increase from One to Three Years

TN status is available to Canadian and Mexican citizens who possess a relevant bachelor's degree, or appropriate professional credentials, and seek temporary entry to the United States to perform services in specified professional occupations for a U.S. employer. Common TN professions include accountants, engineers, systems analysts, and scientists.
